To ease the financial burden and spread the news about the program, the 2nd annual "Camp Out to Stamp Out Homelessness" will be held on Saturday, October 3rd at Veterans Park [more to come on the event as the day draws closer.]

Right now, what is needed are volunteers from SCPC to help with the fund raising event.

We need three {3} Teams.

- 1. Chili Cook off Team one team of at least 3 volunteers to prepare a favorite chili for the cook off challenge and then to serve to raise money.

As a grandparent to another grandparent, I want to share what I read in the AJC this morning. The CDC is doing research on the huge increase of young, 3-5 yr. olds and older kids having severe reactions to alcohol poisoning.
