A reflection on John 16: 31-33.

Before Jesus is arrested, he has a long conversation with his disciples. In John 16, Jesus begins to explain that he will be leaving to go to His Father in Heaven. After Him, the Holy Spirit will come and help guide all believers. The disciples struggle to grasp most of what Jesus says, although he has been warning them since the very beginning that he will not always be with them. At one point in the conversation, Jesus stops speaking figuratively, and clearly states that he is literally going to leave the world and go back to His Father. At this point the disciples declare, "This makes us believe that you came from God!"

After this declaration by the disciples, we read the following verses:

³¹ "Do you now believe?" Jesus replied. ³² "A time is coming and in fact has come when you will be scattered, each to your own home. You will leave me all alone. Yet I am not alone, for my Father is with me.

³³ "I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world."

Finally, FINALLY, the disciples, at least for a moment, believe that Jesus came from God.

This is shocking given Jesus's history on Earth. The disciples didn't fully believe that he was the Son of God when they heard that he was born in a manger to the Virgin Mary. They didn't believe when Jesus turned water into wine at a wedding in Cana. They had their doubts when Jesus fed 5,000 people on a few loaves of fish and bread. But, finally, for a moment, the disciples looked at Jesus and realized that his Father really is God.

And in that realization, there was peace. If you just read verse 31, it doesn't feel much like a peaceful comment. Jesus tells the disciples that he will go home to His Father, and the disciples will disband. They will no longer travel together with Jesus. That's frightening. Except, Jesus tells them these things so that they might have peace. Jesus leaving does not bring them peace. The disciples going back home, alone does not bring them peace.

Realizing that Jesus is the Son of God is what brings them peace.

Jesus is the Son of God. Jesus came into this world to overcome it. In this world, we will have trouble, but we must believe that the baby Jesus who was born in a manger really was the Son of God, and he really did come to save us. In that realization, there is peace.

The "Peanuts" comic strip and I both appeared on the same week in October, 1950. I have always felt a special relationship to Charlie Brown, Lucy, Linus, Snoopy and the rest of the gang. The phrases known to many have become ones I routinely use: happiness is a warm puppy, good grief, wishy-washy, security blanket,

AAUGHH! Who cannot remember Charlie Brown never winning a baseball game, successfully kicking the football or flying a kite? And that pitiful tree he brought home in the Christmas special, only to be unmercifully mocked. Charles Schulz frequently used trees as a symbol of the cross. Perhaps it is the cross which was overlooked again and again while sitting in the tree lot until someone recognized its power and glory. Once brought into a crowd of believers, it was transformed into its splendor and magnificence. This Christmas, may your tree remind you of the cross and our Savior.

Just a quick note on tithes and offerings and the difference between the two: Biblically, a tithe is giving 10% of all one earns to the Lord. The Israelites were under a legal system that required them to give 10% of all they earned to God. Offerings, however, are not the same as tithes. Offerings are gifts given in addition to tithing. Offerings, however, are not limited to money, but can also be time and other resources. What we are hoping to do with the automatic draft is help create a convenient way for us as a church to tithe. This way, money will be debited out of your account and credited to the church without us having to remember to take it out of our paychecks every month. In a lot of ways, this is a closer system to what the Israelites may have had. However, even if you opt to sign up for the automatic draft, you are always welcome to offer additional money for particular projects or events throughout the year in the regular Sunday morning offering. Setting up an automatic draft for tithe does not mean that you can no longer offer additional money, time, energy, and other resources to the church throughout the year. Hopefully that brief lesson on the difference between tithes and offerings is helpful for you as you consider setting up the automatic draft.
