This Sunday, our church was truly blessed. We were filled up to the balcony with family and friends, all dressed in their Easter best. Bright colors matched smiling faces, and Facebook has rightly exploded with pictures. Together, we proclaimed and sang the good news. The world put Christ to death, but God raised him to life. The world put him in a tomb, but God has raised him to heaven, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

It was a joy to celebrate such good news with such good company. As your pastors, we were humbled and grateful for the opportunity to stand before you and proclaim that great truth which has been handed down to us. The truth of Easter Sunday, known as the "mystery of the faith."

Christ has died.

Christ is risen.

Christ will come again.

But Easter is not just a Sunday in the church calendar. It is a season. Easter Sunday is more like the first day of spring. Over the next 50 days, our prayer is that you will carry this good news of God's resurrection into your lives, and continue to chew on it. Let it work on you. Look at the places of your lives that need resurrection: that are in need of hope and new life. Look at them, and do not be afraid. Look out beyond your life to the needs of your homes, your towns, even our world. Look and do not be afraid.

Easter reminds us that even death is not beyond God's power to resurrect. Neither are you, or those you love, or those who you can't figure out how to love. This Easter, we are not able to proclaim that the world has been fixed. We cannot claim that everything has been set right.

But we can proclaim with certainty this world's future.

God has claimed for his own every corner of our sinful lives. He is resurrecting us, and he will start now if we will let him. So, here this announcement once more. Christ has died, but he has been raised from the grave. And he will return, to make this broken world into his heavenly feast.

Easter is 50 days. It began filled with family, friends, and bright smiles. It began with joy. Our prayer is that it will bring more of the same, as God's resurrection power, even now, begins to raise the dead to life.

He is risen! He is risen indeed!
