This week, the Ideal Sunday School class looked at Ephesians chapter 3, and concluded with a bit of homework. They were to take Paul's prayer from the end of chapter 3, and pray it over our church. But they were not to pray it generally. They were to choose a specific person, or a specific ministry, within our congregation, and pray this over them.

14 For this reason I kneel before the Father, 15 from whom every family in heaven and on earth derives its name. 16 I pray that out of his glorious riches he may strengthen you with power through his Spirit in your inner being, 17 so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith. And I pray that you, being rooted and established in love, 18 may have power, together with all the Lord's holy people, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, 19 and to know this love that surpasses knowledge—that you may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God.

20 Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us, 21 to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, for ever and ever! Amen.

Well, this challenge is bigger than the Ideal Sunday School class, so I'm passing it along. Paul's prayer is that the church in Ephesus might be filled with the Holy Spirit, and as they get the Holy Spirit they might be filled with power. Praying for power is not a common prayer in most churches. But it is an important one.

If you feel nervous about praying for power, that's not bad. Power is a dangerous thing. But Christians don't pray for power to impose our will on others. We pray for power so we might to do the will of God. Look at the outcome of such a prayer is in verse 19. The point of the prayer is that someone might be "filled to the measure of all the fullness of God."

What do you think it looks like for someone to be "filled to the measure of all the fullness of God"? Seriously. Take a second and think about that. What would it look like? What change might you see in that person? What transformation might overcome a program?

This prayer from the end of Ephesians is a really powerful one. It prays for power so we might grasp who God is, and that Christ might dwell in us.

If you're stumped on who or what to pray for, here's an option for you. Our church has been looking into starting a new program called Food For Thought. It will try to respond to needs in our local schools for food and educational assistance, by offering a snack, homework help, and supporting relationships with members of our congregation. Our goal is to share the love of Christ in concrete ways.

A group of men and women have set out to see what it would take for this program to be implemented, and we are planning to launch a trial-run of it this March. We're asking that you would consider praying this prayer from Ephesians over Food For Thought. Our hope is that it will be filled with the Spirit of God.

Christian Ed During Lent

A new Sunday School class will be offered during Lent called "Experiencing Prayer." Taught by Pastors Brian and Micaiah, it is actually an extension of the youth Sunday School class, but YOU are invited. Our hope is that our church—across generations—can find ways to pray together. We will be meeting in the Fellowship Hall at 9:45 AM, beginning on February 14th. The class will end on March 20th.

Existing Sunday School classes are invited to continue meeting as they have been, but whoever wishes to join Experiencing Prayer is more than welcome. One warning: It is an activity-based class (it's hard to learn how to pray without actually praying). Please let your leader know if you will be joining this Lenten class.

GUATEMALA MISSION TRIP



Guatemala is a country located in Central America, south of Mexico. It's capital is Guatemala City, and that is where our team will be serving.

Guatemala was once the core of the Mayan civilization. As such, a rich tradition of Mayan culture, language, and crafts still exist. Guatemala endured a long civil war between 1960-1996. That civil war left the country in much disarray.

Several years ago, the Cumberland Presbyterian Church decided to focus on Central America as a mission point. The CP Church has a lot of churches, schools, and ministries already in existence in the United States and in Colombia, South America. Central America is located nicely in between the two, and so our mission's boards decided to focus on Central America. Since this focus began, the CP Church has sent 3 Colombian missionaries to begin work in Guatemala: planting churches, administering a medical clinic, and now staring a Hot Lunch Program.
