The Christian faith has a long tradition of celebrating holidays. We intentionally remember what happened in the past, and celebrate, not because we think it must have been amazing for people then. We remember and celebrate because we believe these events continue to impact us today. We recently celebrated the birth of Jesus as a baby in Nazareth, and remembered his baptism just this past Sunday.

It surely would have been incredible to witness these events firsthand, but the impact of them reverberates to us today. Here is an example, pulled from the gospel of John:

I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life.

John 8:12

It is likely that we have all heard this line from Jesus before. It is also likely that it has become sufficiently normal, sufficiently familiar, that we no longer really *hear* it in a way that makes you wonder. So perhaps you have not heard this line from C.S. Lewis, and it can help us ponder again what it means that Jesus is our light.

I believe in Christianity as I believe that the sun has risen; not only because I see it, but because by it I see everything else.

Did you catch the two parts he describes? C.S. Lewis believes in Christianity, and so in Jesus the Christ, because he has seen it, and because through it he sees everything else. C.S. Lewis, like us, has seen the truths of Christianity in his life. He has seen the power of trusting in God. He has experience how God provides in times of tragedy. He has encountered the power of forgiving those who've sinned against him, and loving his enemy. He believes Christianity because he has seen it.

He also believes it because Christianity lets him understand the world around him. If you read his writings, he uses Christianity to understand love of friends, and love of country, and love of God. Christianity helps him to understand the tragedy of death, as well as the hope that lies beyond death. Christianity revealed to C.S. Lewis the beauty of the world and the power of kindness in a way that nothing else he encountered could.

When Jesus describes himself as the "light of the world," I think we too can hear these two parts. First, we believe it because we have experienced Jesus as a light. Not just for his disciples. Not just for the people who heard him speak or witnessed his miracles. He is a light for the entire world. He is our hope, and we have felt it. He is our peace, and we have experienced it. He is our salvation, and we are receiving it. People continue to be drawn to the Christian faith because they see the light of Christ, and their lives are changed. They can feel it.

Second, after we see this light, we begin to see the entire world differently. Jesus is the light by which we understand everything: ourselves, our families, our purpose, our society. Life and death themselves are only understood rightly because of who Jesus is. Life is something best served living for the sake of others, and death is but the beginning of the rest of eternity.

As you reflect on this, here's a prayer to help.

Jesus, light of the world, renew in me the joy of your salvation. Shine on me, and open my eyes so I can see the world as you see it, transformed by who you are and what you have done.

Amen.



July 9th - 16th, 2016

WHAT: A Trip to Guatemala City to work with the Hot Lunch Program (where we sent the Loaves and Fishes money).

A trip like this will help us build a relationship with Cumberland Presbyterians in Guatemala, to learn from them, love on them, be tourists (and who hasn't wanted to worship in Spanish?!)

WHO: 8-10 adults. We cold use both medical professionals AND other adults. Medical professionals would work with the kids doing health checks in relation to their specialty. Any other adults would work with the kids, teaching Bible Lessons, cooking meals, and playing games.

WHEN: We would be flying out on Saturday, July 9th, and returning on Saturday, July 16th.

COST: \$1000-\$1200/person (depending on plane tickets)

DEADLINE: In order to reserve lodging and buy plane tickets, we need commitments by JANUARY 31st, with a \$200 deposit and an application. Another \$450 will be due March 1st. The remaining balance will be due May 15th.
