
I am sitting in my office with a wall of cards around me. All these little reminders that this is a church that deeply cares and that prays for its leaders. Thank you.

Every day, I walk in and realize I have a fortress of cards and of people surrounding me in prayer. And that's what we are called to do.

Brother Lawrence was a monk who had the very nonspiritual task f washing dishes in the monastery. But, as he did so, he discovered some insights into spiritual disciplines. (For more, look into the book, *The Practice of the Presence of God*).

For Brother Lawrence, the most effective way to communicate with God was to do so during ordinary work. For him, it was a serious mistake to think of our prayer time as being different from any other. All our daily activities should unite us with God, or put us in God's presence.

When you read Lawrence's book, you expect to read about praying and fasting and spiritual disciplines. Instead, you read about doing dishes. The idea is that you don't *do* spiritual things; you are spirt-filled or you are not.



So, wash the dishes. Drop your kids off at ball practice. Drive to work. Type out some emails. Write a card. Pray with a cup of coffee in hand. Mow the yard. Weed the garden. Clean the kitchen. And do it all while practicing being in the presence of God. That's how we pray without ceasing- for this church, for one another, and for our families.

May God bless you and be present with you, even in the most ordinary of tasks.

Cumberland Presbyterian General Assembly will be in Nashville, TN from June 20-24






Mark your Calendars for this year's Vacation Bible School May 23rd—May 27th
